HADDY EASTER

PASTOR JEREMIAH'S MESSAGE

Luke 24:5c "He is not here, but has risen"

As a child I admit, I didn't understand why Easter was more important than Christmas. I fear I judged the Christian Holy Days on how many presents I might get. I also admit, I didn't like Easter because the week before we talked of crucifixion, and on Easter we talked of tombs (as a child I didn't like to think about graveyards, or tombs or such things.) I could tell part of Jesus' story was a sad story, and when I was young, I had a hard time seeing the rest of the story, so to speak, seeing that the story had a joyful ending.

This month of April we will finish Lent and the end of Lent is Holy Week. There is joy and fun on Palm Sunday as we wave branches, though I find profound peace and feel love through communion, which we will remember on Maundy Thursday. Fundamentally the stories of Holy Week are sad. A good person preaching love, was killed by people; some for religious reason, some for political reasons, all because they didn't want anything in the world to change. They were okay with torturing another person to death to keep things from changing and hopefully to scare others who might say God wanted the world to change. That is a sad story. I'd like to think there is no more sadness in our world, but of course there are still people who would cause harm, or even sacrifice lives so they can feel powerful and have their way. Humans tend to sin, and Jesus' crucifixion and all other unjust deaths inflicted by humans, remind us of the terrible consequences of sin.

However, and this is how Jeremiah W. Thompson at age 42 sees the world differently than I did at age 6 or 7. I now see the joy of Easter! We could focus only on the sad parts, but the story doesn't end with sadness. Christ arose! The power of sin, hate, and greed, are not more powerful than God's love. Christ lives again, resurrected to share with us hope. To let us know sin isn't the end, to let us know death isn't the end, but to show us that love is the end. Easter is about love and joy and life. This wonderful Holy Day comes in the spring when the flowers bloom (the crocuses are already blooming as a I write this in late March), and the birds are singing, and animals are having new babies, and the world (in the Northern Hemisphere) is turning from winter to spring, to life, growth, food, and joy. Easter is the great sign that God's love can turn the world around, and that God is always loving and helping us.

So let us seek to live into being Easter people. Let us love, and rejoice, and share love with others, so that we can be more fully part of the change of all things towards love. The love that God showed us all on that first Easter Sunday long ago!



GLOBAL ADVANCE PROJECTS

Lituania in Mission Together (A12168A)

Supporting church development, pastor's salaries, pastor & lay leadership, training and out-reach is the purpose of Lithuania in Mission Together. Our primary goals are: **Development of indigenous** committed and skilled spiritual leaders by providing at least two significant training events for pastors each year for their personal growth and the growth of the church in Lituania; Development of **new congregations in Lithuania** by starting 3 new congregations in the next four years in new communities in Lithuania; Development of socialdiaconal out-reach ministries in Lithuania by increasing the avenues and connections with partner churches, so that more resources are available for outreach ministries; Expand Partner Newsletter to include information about all the programs of the Lithuania UMC; and Develop local out-reach programs through the local chuches to assist with human and spiritual needs.

Midwest Mission - MMDC (#50000150)

Since 2000, MMDC has shown God's love in practical ways through the distribution of education, health, micro-business and disaster relief supplies, meeting basic human needs around the world and around the corner. MMDC distributes its kits, resources and supplies after receiving a request. Supplies are given free of charge, regardless of gender, race or religion. MMDC connects with local aid organizations by providing items that are recieved that do not meet kit requirements. One of 10 cooperating depots in the United Methodist Committee on Relief (UMCOR) Supply Network, MMDC distributes UMCOR supplies in response to disastors within the U.S. MMDC also partners with Christians in Mission, Food for the Poor, Franciscan Mission Warehuse, and U.S. Southern Command.

GENERAL CHURCH FUNDS: APPORTIONMENTS

World Service Fund

When UM congregations give to the annual General Church apportionments, they contribute to work that is done around the world. This fund supports all UMC general agencies and supports missionary personnel and administrative costs of many areas.

Black College Fund

Supports the programs and ministries of 11 historically black colleges and universities, including one medical school. These gifts reflect the value our Church has on education, especially those who have been historically excluded.

Ministerial Education Fund

Provides funds for recruitment of clergy candidates and provides financial support for 13 UM seminaries, including Garrett-Evangelical Theological Seminary in Evanston.

General Administration Fund

Helps maintain a system of management oversight and fiscal accountability, and underwrites General Conference and the Judicial Council.

Episcopal Fund

Provides for UM bishops worldwide, including salaries, housing, office expenses and travel costs of active bishops, and provide pension and health benefit coverage for bishops and family members in a bishop's household.

Interdenominational Cooperation Fund

Supports UMC's with ecumenical and interreligious partners such as the World Council of Churches, Churches Uniting in Christ, and World Methodist Council.

Africa University, Zimbabwe

Supports the first fully accredited UM-related institution on the African continent. The University promotes independence and empowerment through a diverse student body from across the continent.






