

### PASTOR JEREMIAH'S MESSAGE

I admit 2020 has been a brutal year in some ways. Covid-19, the lives lost, the economic disruption, the disruption in our day to day lives, these things have got me down. Also, the social divisions in society based on Democrat or Republican, MAGA or anti-Trump, rural and urban, between people of different faiths, or ethnicities, or different education levels, these also get me down. Between Covid and its effects, and the divisions between people in our society, shoot, between people perhaps in our own families, it's a hard time.

Even so, I am excited, happy, and joyful that we have reached the Advent season. The 4 weeks before Christmas as we prepare to celebrate the birth of our Teacher, Savior, and Hope, Jesus Christ. I invite you to worship with us each week on Zoom, or to watch the worship videos on Facebook or YouTube as we use the old familiar Carol We Three Kings, as a way to think about who Jesus is and what he came to do. I invite you to participate in our Christmas Eve service, as we will, in a safe and socially distant way, hear the lessons about Jesus again, and sing the old familiar carols. I urge you and your household to spend this holiday season focused on what "Christmas is all about," Jesus and Jesus coming to change everything for the better. Finally in this season of giving, I pray you will help someone in some way however you can with your time, your talents, or your material blessings, let us share what it is we have this year.

Christmas is coming, it will be different than many a Christmas before. But it is coming with words of hope and joy and Good News from God. Let us prepare to welcome the Christ Child once more. Amen!!!


A graveside service was held for the family / per Ralph's request.

# THE UNITED METHODIST CELEBRATING

#### "GIVING TUESDAY" ON DECEMBER 1ST

Giving Tuesday — Dec. 1 this year — affords us an opportunity to help those we may not even know and make a difference in their lives.

#### **Christmas Eve Carol Service**
