**We Celebrated with her during Coffee/
Fellowship time on Sunday, Nov. 12th**

**The article below was sent to our
Prairie South District for their
newsletter and we wanted to share it
with you also.**

In 1935, Dorothy became a member of the Malta United Methodist Church. During high school years she was collector of funds from Sunday School classes. She sang in the choir and taught Sunday School for over 20 years. She was Junior Choir Director for a few years and taught Bible School for many years along with Church Historian for over 20 years. Dorothy was Treasurer of the United Methodist Women for the Malta church on and off for many years. She was treasurer for DeKalb District United Methodist Women for 4 years, which involved in the bookkeeping of the Jennings Lyon Nursing Home in Sheridan. There were 62 churches sending funds to the district at that time.

Soon after her term, it was decided to close the Jennings Lyon Nursing Home and she was involved in the finance portion of getting that settled. It was turned over to the Sheridan Methodist Church who now runs this as a Child Day Care Center. Dorothy traveled to meetings in Chicago serving on the Northern Illinois Conference Board of Pensions for 13 years. Normally, this is a 10 year term, but they wanted rural people and women so she served a

longer term. A number of times over the years Dorothy served as chairman of the annual church Chicken Dinner as well as chairman of the annual rummage sale (both were sponsored by the United Methodist Women) – usually also being the treasurer for the event. She was the “instigator” for organizing cookbooks - both the “Home Cookin’ in the 1950’s and “More Home Cookin’” in 1981 which were compiled with the help of many church members. The Farm Progress Show was held in Malta in 1975 on the Jim Willrett farm. The attendance was approximately 300,000 over the 3-day period. Dorothy was co-chairman of the (7) food tents, along with co-chairman of the host food tent (hosted by Malta Methodist Church). Each food tent had to have 60 people helping each of the 3 days of the show and the host tent served food to the workers the entire week prior and the day after the show. In order to get 60 workers each day they had relatives from out of state come to help out. All other tents were hosted by other churches from the area. During the Farm Progress Show, money was collected by a local banker and a state government man. Following the show, the churches had to take the state to court to get the sales tax money back which was due to them due to tax exempt status. That was quite a challenge!

Dorothy also served on the 125th and 150th Anniversary Celebration Committees for the church.

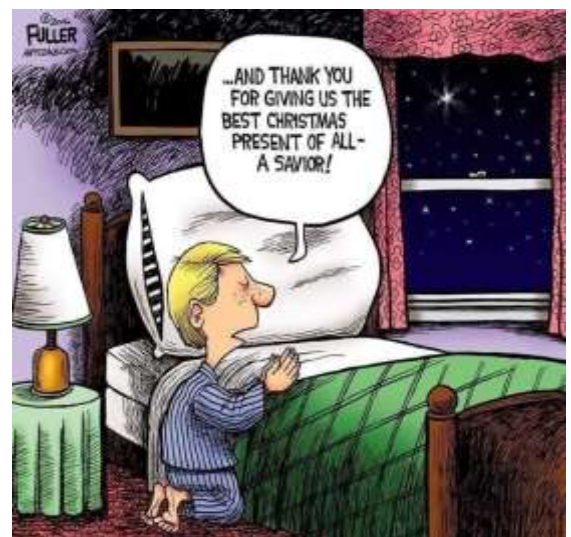

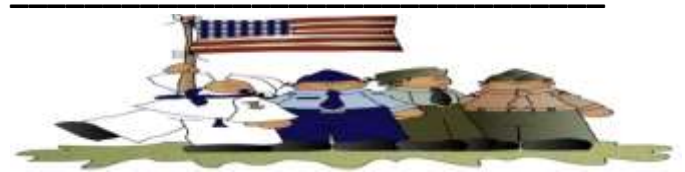

The Outreach & Mission Committee met following Worship Service on Sunday, February 5, 2023. The purpose of this meeting was to complete a plan for the Malta United Methodist Church to meet the requirements of LIVING THE BEATITUDES.

A CALL TO ACTION AND CONNECTION.

We reviewed the 2023 Northern Illinois Conference General Church offerings 2023. There are seven Sundays which special envelopes will be bulletin inserts. Money collected as offerings will be mailed to the conference.

We are committed to be a connectional giving church. We will pay 100% of the churches conference and general church apportionments. The 2023 amount is \$10,834. Our church membership is 116 divided into our church amount equals \$90.00 per member.

Our church gifts are to be sent by the treasurer to P.O. Box 5656, Carol Stream, IL 60197-5656. It is suggested the funds be mailed each quarter.

We as the Outreach/Mission Committee unanimously decided to select the same Advanced Projects as we had in 2022. (See Mission Links 2023)
