PASTOR JEREMIAH'S MESSAGE

⁷ Beloved, let us love one another, because love is from God; everyone who loves is born of God and knows God. ⁸ Whoever does not love does not know God, for God is love. (I John 4:7-8 NRSV)

Our perceptions of how things are and reality can be different. As a child I perceived that winter started in December (probably due to all those snowflakes and snowmen, Christmas decorations and songs), and I thought of things getting milder by the time we reached February. I have since learned the reality in Illinois, at least our part of it, one is much more likely to see more heavy snow in February than December. (And frankly there is often more snow in March than December.) I needed to change how I thought about things to match reality, and frankly knowing what I know now, I may not like that winter can linger. But it frustrates me less, because I know that is what it is "supposed to do" in our part of the world.

I thought about how our perceptions can be changed by God, and above all, by the love that God demonstrates to us through Jesus Christ. This month of February, cold, grey, and snowy, as it can be, is also the month when we celebrate Valentine's Day and the idea of love. So as I sat down to write this, I

was thinking about love, and how love changes how we see things, and flat-out changes all things.

I believe at the heart of all, God is and God's actions - is love. I believe the core message of Christianity is that God is changing the world through love. I believe the foundation starts at the core of life for those who seek to follow Jesus. They are to love God and love others. How powerful are these words from John that states, "that God is love?"

This month in our worship services we will ponder how we can experience God's love through reading the Bible, and share God's love through evangelism. In both these activities, and all things, I seek to live life through the lens of Jesus - the lens of love. How can love, this beautiful gift from God, guide all we do? How can love help us see reality in a new way, and help us, with God's guidance, make life better for everyone? Let us all consider how love can change our perceptions and show us comforting, beautiful, helpful realities, that help us show love to others.



from **Lituania United Methodist Church**Rev. Remigijus Matulaitis

Like the rest of the world, Lithuania continues to struggle with the impact of Covid 19 on each of us. We are still able to do in person worship with the help of our Lay Ministers. Jelena and Andrust (two of our pastors) have now moved to minister in Estonia. So our Lay leadership is crucial to us at this point. It means that Rev. Walla (Missionary) and Rev. Remigijus are the only clergy in Lithuania for today. Our churches are open for Sunday services and weekly ministries with minimal restrictions. We are able to sing and share Holy Communion, but keeping within Covid-19 safety instructions and that means no sharing of "passing the peace". We now have virtual quarterly Bible Studies with our "Friends of Lithuania" group.

Story of St. Valentine

"The story of Valentine's Day begins in the third century with an oppressive Roman emperor and a humble Christian Martyr. The emperor was Claudius II. The Christian was Valentinus.

Claudius had ordered all Romans to worship twelve gods, and had made it a crime punishable by death to associate with Christians. But Valentinus was dedicated to the ideals of Christ; not even the

threat of death could keep him from practicing his beliefs. He was arrested and imprisoned.

During the last weeks of Valentinus's life a remarkable thing happened. Seeing that he was a man of learning, the jailer asked whether his daughter, Julia, might be brought to Valentinus for lessons. She had been blind since birth. Julia was a pretty young girl with a quick mind. Valentinus read stories of Rome's history to her. He described the world of nature to her. He taught her arithmetic and told her about God. She saw the world through his eyes, trusted his wisdom, and found comfort in his quiet strength.

"Valentinus, does God really hear our prayers?"
Julia asked one day. "Yes, my child, He hears each one."

"Do you know what I pray for every morning and every night? I pray that I might see. I want so much to see everything you've told me about!"
"God does what is best for us if we will only believe in Him," Valentinus said. "Oh, Valentinus, I do believe! I do!" She knelt and grasped his hand. They sat quietly together, each praying. Suddenly there was a brilliant light in the prison cell. Radiant, Julia screamed, "Valentinus, I can see! I can see!" "Praise be to God!" Valentinus exclaimed, and he knelt in prayer.

On the eve of his death Valentinus wrote a last note to Julia, urging her to stay close to God. He signed it, "From your Valentine."

His sentence was carried out the next day, February 14, 270 A.D., near a gate that was later named Porta Valentini in his memory. He was buried at what is now the Church of Praxedes in Rome. It is said that Julia planted a pink-blossomed almond tree near his grave. Today, the almond tree remains a symbol of abiding love and friendship.

On each February 14, Saint Valentine's Day, messages of affection, love, and devotion are exchanged around the world.



Wednesday March 2, 2022, 7:00 PM with Communion!

Ash Wednesday is the first day of the season of Lent. (The 40 days, not including Sundays before Easter,) will be on March 2, 2022, and Malta UMC will have a 7:00 PM worship service that evening with Communion. This will be an in-person worship service, and we will also have a Zoom broadcast. Lent is a season for us to look at our lives, and to repent. That is with God's help, changing the ways we live to be more in-line with Jesus' teachings. Ash Wednesday in particular, is a day of repentance. Where those who follow Jesus are invited to examine their lives. See where we have caused harm, ask forgiveness, make amends, and then change how we live, with God's help, to not cause harm in the future.

Signs of repentance, since ancient times, have been ashes, and sack cloth or burlap. If we were not in a time of pandemic, we would mark ourselves with the sign of the cross in ashes, as a sign that we ask God's forgiveness. That we understand our mortality, and that we seek to live in a new way, so

as to better share Christ's love. As we are in a time of pandemic, this ancient ritual could put the health of some people at risk, so we are turning to another sign of repentance. From the time before Jesus, possibly 3000 years or more, those who've sought to repent have worn sack cloth to show the sincerity of their desire to change their ways. As part of our service on Ash Wednesday, we will each receive a piece of sack cloth, as a visual reminder for us of our desire to repent and live lives more fully guided by God's love.

You are invited, as all are in our community, to join us for worship Ash Wednesday evening as we repent, pray, hear from the scriptures, and finally take communion; all as a sign that we seek to repent. To live in a new way guided by God's love shown in Jesus. May we be changed by God's forgiveness and love, and may we be equipped to share that love with others in Jesus Name this season of Lent and all year long.



Carry Christ Into The New Year! By Bishop John L. Hopkins

"Peace I leave with you. My peace I give you. I give to you not as the world gives. Don't be troubled or afraid." John 14:27

As the calendar turns to 2022, we look back with grief and gratitude for all that has happened in this past year. We also look to the future with uncertainty and hope. How do you face uncertainty? What gives you peace?

As a young Christian, I became aware that when I remembered what Jesus had done for me, I felt close to him. Of course, when I became busy, it was easy to forget that Jesus was present in my life. When I was afraid or sick, I would turn to God, remember Jesus, and sense the Holy Spirit was with me. With the "Trinity" surrounding me, I may not have been invincible, but I certainly knew I was not alone.

Over the years, people have give me items to carry, so I would know the presence of Christ whenever I might be "troubled or afraid." I have nails from Good Friday services, a "Cross in My Pocket", a cross

from the Holy Land, and a "Palm Cross" to hold on to when facing surgery.

I learned two things carrying Christ with me. First, when you are mindful of Jesus, you do not have your mind on all that gives you fear. Secondly, when you face uncertainty with gratitude, you find joy in the midst of unexpected change.

As an old Christian, I still get sick and afraid. I grieve and give thanks over events during this past year. I cannot predict the future any better than when I was young. However, I know what to cling to for peace that passes all understanding.

Carry Christ with you into this New Year. When you are facing a relationship problem, take Jesus with you. When you are going through a medical issue, take Jesus with you. When you are heavy with grief or despair, take Jesus with you. When you do justice, love kindness, and walk humbly, take Jesus with you. Cling to something or someone who reminds you of what God has done in your life. Give thanks and find joy day by day in the year to come.

Prayer: O God, we give you thanks for the peace you have given us in Jesus Christ. Help us to cling to that peace as we love and serve you in this New Year. Amen.



Lenten Study: *The Lord's Prayer*

As we move into the season of Lent, a time of reflecting and changing our lives, remembering Jesus' death, and finally preparing for the joy of Easter, Jesus' resurrection, the final sign of God's love is more powerful than sin and death. You are invited to be part of an all church small group study on the Lord's Prayer by Rev. Adam Hamilton. (We also have a book for children and families to read together on this same topic.)
