





PASTOR JEREMIAH'S MESSAGE

I Corinthians 12:4: "There are different spiritual gifts but the same Spirit."

One of my favorite podcasters has in recent months been doing shows about human prehistory. He's been talking about how humans, after the last ice age, started finding new ways of living in settled communities all over the world, compared to the ways that most humans had been nomads for tens of thousands of years before that. What's interesting is that people found ways to be able to settle in so many different ways. In some places they discovered better ways to fish for the bounty of the seas. In some places people learned to hunt, catch, forage, and pick a wide variety of foods. In some places humans learned that the nuts of the trees can provide stable year round food, if you learn to process and store them the right way. The result of all this was that humans from the Americas, to Africa, to every place in between started living in the same places more or less permanently, as many of us do today. What I find fascinating is that humans could achieve the same goal in so many ways.

That got me thinking about how God works through people. In many ways, I believe in a pretty simple theology and purpose in life. I believe God loves us, wants us to be in relationship with God and wants us to love others. I believe Jesus shows us God's love. The thing is, though the same loving God calls to us all and Christ teaches us all to love, the ways we live that out are so varied. I've seen people serving God with hammers and nails, the written word, with a syringe, in the cab of a tractor, and so many more. Some people live out God's call

by teaching children, some by encouraging and supporting others, some through an emphasis in prayer, and list goes on and on. The point is, if all these people can follow God's calling, and they can bless other people. To go back to my initial paragraph, just as humans all over the world have learned what they can grow or gather in there part of the world to make a living, so God in a huge variety of ways, gifts us to know blessing and be a blessing to others.

2020 won't go down in history as a joyful year for many people, there are a thousand reasons for that, that we all know. However, as we enter 2021 there are thousands of ways that God will be gifting people to bless others and to grow closer to God. This new year, like all new year's, is a chance to dedicate our lives again or for the first time to loving God, deepening our relationship with God, and letting God's Holy Spirit show us how we can be a gift and blessing to others. The question is not, will God gift each and every one of us, but the question is, will we follow God's leading and use the gifts God gives us?

It is my hope and prayer that as we start this new year, we keep our ears, eyes, heart, mind and more open to the ways the Holy Spirit of God is calling to us. In the pain of our world today, there are so many ways we can help someone else in Jesus' Name. Whoever you are reading this, God is gifting you to help someone. Will you do it? I pray we all do, as we start this new year, and as we hopefully come towards the end of the pandemic. We can all, guided by God, help our society enter a new and better, and above all a more loving era. May we all use our gifts, diverse as they are, in Jesus' Name. Amen.

The Church Council met on December 7th and was held via ZOOM with 12 members and Pastor Jeremiah present.

Special recognition was given to Jacque Fucilla and Jodi Willrett for their organization and planning of the very successful drive-through Fall Supper. Over 500 meals were served and profit was nearly \$9,000. Jamie & Larissa Willrett, Jacque & Brian Fucilla, Jodi & Ken Slade, and Jonamac Orchard were recognized for their significant donations covering Fall Supper expenses.

Evergent will be the new Internet provider for our church. We will now have Internet in the sanctuary allowing better live broadcast of services and video broadcasts of services when in-person church resumes.

Dave Gommel gave an update on dispersal of items in the Northwest Church building. Former NW members and Malta members have had the opportunity to secure items. Many thanks to Dave and Jeanette Gommel for their work and dedication to this project.

Trustees chair, Tom Plote, reported the new A/C unit has been installed at the church. We are still looking for mason contractors to bid on tuck pointing the church building as well as someone to do fascia and gutter repairs.

Jodi Slade reported on the virtual meeting of the Northern Illinois Annual Conference. Three pieces of legislation were passed:

- 3) Budget for 2021 of \$4.2 million

1 2/3 c. sugar

3 c. mini marshmallows

2/3 c. Carnation evaporated milk

1 tsp. vanilla

¼ tsp. salt

½ c. chopped nuts

1 c. chocolate chips

Blend sugar, milk and salt in large saucepan. Heat to boiling, stirring constantly.

Boil 5 minutes, time it. Remove from heat. Stir in chocolate chips until melted.

Add 1 ½ Cups miniature marshmallows and stir until melted. Stir in vanilla. Fold in nuts. Fold in remaining 1 ½ cups miniature marshmallows and pour into buttered 8x8 pan quickly before marshmallows melt. Cool before cutting.


