





PASTOR JEREMIAH'S MESSAGE

Psalm 22

- 1 My God, my God, why have you forsaken me? Why are you so far from helping me, from the words of my groaning?
- 2 O my God, I cry by day, but you do not answer; and by night, but find no rest.

This Psalm is the one that Jesus quoted as he died on the cross; it's a Psalm where the Psalmist pleaded with God for help in times of trouble and expressed their true feelings in a time of pain. It's not an easy or fun Psalm to read, but it's a Psalm I think most people can identify with if they are honest. There are times when we feel alone, even abandoned by God.

I thought of this Psalm as I considered the start of 2022. The last two years have been I think for American society, as a whole, the most stressful and painful of my lifetime. Much of that stress has stemmed from the Covid-19 pandemic, and I believe the pandemic has made all the other tensions in our society and world that much worse. Now sadly as we start 2022, we are in this December seeing another wave of Covid, with the Omicron variant causing more cases of the virus here in our area, and that has already affected some of our church activities and may affect more. It's hard!

It's hard not being able to do so many things we once enjoyed. It's hard remembering those lost and seeing the continuing impact of a virus on our lives. For me it's hard to see so much fear, misinformation, and anger thrown around when we need love and compassion to help each other. It's hard.

God knows it's hard. God in the form of Jesus Christ, somehow fully God and fully human knows that life is hard sometimes. God knows about the cold, and the soreness, the fear, the anguish, the frustration, all of it. As the theologian and philosopher Alfred North Whitehead put it God is one "who understands." As we face a New Year, that may frankly have a higher degree of difficulty than any of us want, I take comfort that the Psalms, and Jesus, and so many other places in the bible give us permission and words to express if we feel struggle right now. God can take us truly saying what we feel, and God won't stop loving us for feeling it. It's okay this winter if we need to cry out to God in some way.

I believe that God is with us, as we move from the season of Christmas to Epiphany. We remember Emmanuel, Jesus Christ, God with us, and remember that God is with us! God loves us. God is guiding us all towards something better, something better in this

world and the next. God will give us the strength we need. God will comfort us when we cry, God loves us and there is nothing we can do about it. So, in whatever way we need, let us speak to God. Let us know that God is there, and that makes this a not Happy New Year, for happiness is short term, but Joyful New Year for God's love can give us joy, peace, and hope in all times. May you feel God's love as we start this New Year. Let us all be guided by that love to do what we can for the best 2022 possible, for us and for all people, in Jesus' Name, Amen.

1 2/3 c. sugar

3 c. mini marshmallows

2/3 c. Carnation evaporated milk

1 tsp. vanilla

¼ tsp. salt

½ c. chopped nuts

1 c. chocolate chips

Blend sugar, milk and salt in large saucepan. Heat to boiling, stirring constantly.

Boil 5 minutes, time it. Remove from heat. Stir in chocolate chips until melted.

Add 1 ½ Cups miniature marshmallows and stir until melted. Stir in vanilla. Fold in nuts. Fold in remaining 1 ½ cups miniature marshmallows and pour into buttered 8x8 pan quickly before marshmallows melt. Cool before cutting.




