



PASTOR JEREMIAH'S MESSAGE

19 Therefore, go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, 20 teaching them to obey everything that I've commanded you. Look, I myself will be with you every day until the end of this present age." (Matthew 28:19-20, Common English Bible)

This passage has become known in Christian history and theology as the great commission. This passage offers key guidance for how Jesus Christ asks us to invite others to follow his teachings. This passage also is at the root of the mission statement of the United Methodist Church: to make disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world.

I thought of this passage and this mission statement as we start a new calendar year. New Years brings New Year's resolutions. In my experience many of these resolutions aren't something brand new. Rather they are incorporating things we already know by bringing blessings to us and others into our lives. For instance in my life, I know I need to exercise in 2023. Now something I need to do in this new year is do more stretching exercises. These aren't the same as some things I've

done in the past, but they are exercises. The key idea is the same, even though what I need to do might be different.

In the year ahead all of us as individual followers of Jesus Christ, and as a community named Malta United Methodist Church we will be called to live out the great commission. We as a community will be asked to think about how we can help make disciples of Jesus Christ and help transform our world. That commission isn't new. It's almost two thousand years old. However, how we do this, I think that's likely to be new and different. There will be discussion about how we organize our congregation to make decisions, about how we work in partnership with other churches, about how we can best use our building to bless our community, and discussions about things that I am not thinking of, as I write this because they will come up as the months progress.

The question for all of us is how we can be open to God's guidance in the weeks and months ahead, so that as individuals we can follow Jesus. and so that as a community we can live out Christ's commission. Let us enter this year with our hearts open and see how God will guide us. Happy New Year!

ANNUAL CHURCH CONFERENCE

UPDATE:

Wednesday, Dec. 7, 2022 SPRC met at 6:30 p.m. and the rest of the congregation met at 7:00 p.m.

Attendance: Ed Cheek, Tom Plote, Harry Berg, Marilyn Berg, Kitty Jouris, Ruth Hueber, Mary Lynn McArtor Marcia Hueber, Dave Gommel, Nancy Plote, Sue Augustine, Bill Augustine, Pastor Jeremiah Thompson

Pastor Jeremiah Thompson, who presided in the absence of our District Superintendent, Brian Gilbert called the meeting to order at 7:04 p.m.

We opened by singing "Spirit Song." accompanied by Nancy Plote. Mary Lynn McArtor read scripture from Matthew 3:13-17. The Message from Bishop Hopkins was read in unison. Pastor asked if anyone present remembered his or her baptism. A brief discussion on "remembering our baptism" followed. We also discussed briefly what God is calling us to do in the New Year. Suggestions included getting people together/bringing them into the church, possibly through potlucks, game nights, etc. How do we confess Jesus as our Savior? Participate in worship, prayer group, interest groups, Bible study, Outreach to the wider area—Salvation Army Food Pantry, Angel Tree, Midwest

Mission, etc. We sang hymn "Love Came Down at Christmas."

Sue Augustine presented the Statistical Report on Membership. Pastor wants us to see the positive points in our report, not the fact we are losing some off our membership roll. The positive points are: we have a Sunday School of 8 children; we have an Adult Sunday School; we have a student in confirmation; we had two adult baptisms; and we have three new/active members.

A vote was called for and passed to remove seven people from our Membership who have been inactive and did not respond to our communication for three years.

Final membership total is now 116.

Next we reviewed the Nominations for Lay Leadership for 2022-2023. --Add Nancy Plote to Finance & Stewardship --Add Mary Lynn McArtor to Church Council --Add Kitty Jouris to Records & History. Voted to approve the list as amended, noting Ed Cheek is now our Annual Conference Delegate. Marcia Hueber and Mary Lynn McArtor are Certified Lay Servants. Ed Cheek, chair of our Church Council, signed their requests for renewal.

The Budget recommendation was received from Staff Parish Committee. Pastoral salary increase of 3% equal to \$100 per month is recommended. Pastor also requested a \$10,000 parsonage exclusion be allowed.





Motion was made to approve budget as recommended. Motion carried.

The Chair of the meeting entertained a motion to adjourn. Marilyn Berg moved, Tom Plote seconded. Meeting adjourned at 7:50 p.m.



SNOWBALL FUDGE

1 2/3 c. sugar

3 c. mini marshmallows

2/3 c. Carnation evaporated milk

1 tsp. vanilla

¼ tsp. salt

½ c. chopped nuts

1 c. chocolate chips

Blend sugar, milk and salt in large saucepan. Heat to boiling, stirring constantly. Boil 5 minutes, time it. Remove from heat.

Stir in chocolate chips until melted.

Add 1 ½ Cups miniature marshmallows and stir

until melted. Stir in vanilla. Fold in nuts. Fold in remaining 1½ cups miniature marshmallows and pour into buttered 8x8 pan quickly before marshmallows melt. Cool before cutting.
