DASTOR JEREMIAH'S MESSAGE

We've entered the season of Lent, and this is a time when I feel called to reflect on about faith, about my relationship with God, and about what it means to be a Christ Follower. This year in Lent, I've been thinking about something I have not considered before. Lent, is not just a time to grow personally closer to God, but also a time to consider how we can reach out in love to others.

There has always been a debate within Christianity, and perhaps particularly within Methodism, about making sure faith is both personal and public. Now when I say public, I don't mean making big showy displays about our faith all the time. What I mean, is how are we, in a sense, helping the public? How is our loving relationship with Christ inspiring us to show love to those around us and make a better world? This theme of both growing close to God and loving the world is a key part of our Lenten Bible Study of Luke.

For most of my life I've thought of Lenten activities as personal, a closer connection to God in this time of preparation for Easter. This year however, I am considering how God is calling me to reach out to

others. I believe that God is calling all of us to a deeper prayer life and a time of closer connection this Lent. However, what is God inviting us to do to show love to others? Would this be a good time of year to find a worthy organization to volunteer with, or is there a friend or neighbor we can support as they journey through a difficult time? Can we be part of some effort to help others, for instance those who lost their homes in the earthquake in Turkey/Syria, or war refugees from Ukraine or Ethiopia?

How can we all reach "up" towards God and reach out and help others this month (and every month)?

I encourage you to consider making a donation today and let's help the kids of Malta, and our elementary school.




"FOOD PANTRY"

The Outreach & Mission Committee met following Worship Service on Sunday, February 5, 2023. The purpose of this meeting was to complete a plan for the Malta United Methodist Church to meet the requirements of LIVING THE BEATITUDES.

A CALL TO ACTION AND CONNECTION.

We reviewed the 2023 Northern Illinois Conference General Church offerings 2023. There are seven Sundays which special envelopes will be bulletin inserts. Money collected as offerings will be mailed to the conference.
