PASTOR JEREMIAH'S MESSAGE

New Era: 3 There's a season for everything and a time for every matter under the heavens (Ecclesiastes 3:1 Common English Bible Translation)

Malta United Methodist Church has begun a time of transition and will enter a new era of our ministry and life together on July 1, 2023. So that we and they can better manage our resources and put more of those resources towards reaching out to share love in Jesus' name with our community. We will become part of a 2-point charge with Grace United Methodist Church, of Maple Park, IL. I will continue to serve as the pastor here in Malta, and live in the parsonage, but will also be the pastor for that congregation.

This may come as a surprise to some of you, so please let me share some background. Our church financially has held its own, even during the pandemic, and unlike many churches our giving has even increased a bit over the past few years. However, the economic reality is that a church usually needs have more than 60 and ideally more than 80 people a week in worship, regularly participating in church activities to be able to support a full-time pastor. Our church usually has about half that. Grace Church is about the same size as Malta, and because of that, they had been sharing a pastor with the Sycamore United Methodist Church. However, their current Pastor, Rev. Joe Munro is being moved to another church and the Sycamore church is hiring a fulltime associate to do the youth and family ministry that Joe led. So the Maple Park Church was looking to be partnered with another congregation.

Our church leadership had already realized that long term we needed to be partnered with another congregation, and had approached our district superintendent (the pastor who is my immediate supervisor and has oversight for 73 churches in our area) about being partnered with a church starting in 2024. However, when Grace church became open for a partnership, and since our churches are close to each other and match very well, the Bishop, our DS, and the Cabinet (the other district superintendents) asked if we would be willing to partner this year. Our elected leadership believed it was in our best interest to partner this year, and so starting July 1st, Malta and Maple Park will be a 2-point-charge, and I will be the Pastor at both churches.

So what changes will this bring? The largest change is worship time. Our church has been asked to and has accepted to move our worship time to 11:00 AM, starting Sunday July 2. This means that we will be moving Adult Sunday School and Fellowship time to before worship rather than after. You can sleep in on Sunday and then come for Sunday School at 10 am, get some coffee and treats, see your friends, and then worship our loving and wonderful God at 11 am! This is a change, and it will take some adjustment, but we hope it will be a long term positive for our congregation.

Other changes may be less noticeable, but will include the following. Two days a week I will be at the office at Grace Church in Maple Park during the day, and I will work from here in Malta 2 days a week, and I plan to continue to have my Sabbath on Fridays. As for Saturdays I expect both churches will sometimes have activities on that day and I will seek to split my time between. I won't be able to teach our Adult Sunday School as I did before, so we will be moving towards a lay leader for adult Sunday School. I will miss that time with you all, and hope we can still do occasional short term small groups together. We hope that our two churches can have some activities together to get to know each other. We also hope that our youth, children, and families can do some joint events. Long term, perhaps we could even have a joint mission trip, but we will have to see if that's feasible.

You may have questions, concerns, or other feelings about all this. I ask you to please be in communication with me and our Staff Parish Committee, ask your questions please, share your feelings, and let's talk. I can't promise you that we can do what you might want, but I promise to listen! I believe long term, this will strengthen our congregation. Over a full year this new situation will save us about \$35,000. That will be a great ease to our budget, and that will free up some money that I hope and pray we can use to do good ministry sharing the Love of Jesus with Malta, and with our world.

Marcia Hueber, Chair of SPRC, received a call from our Dist. Superintendent on Friday, April 21st and Brian asked her to make this announcement in church on Sunday, April 23rd.

As of July 1, 2023, Malta will become a 2-point charge for Pastor Jeremiah Thompson.

He has accepted the position as half-time Pastor with Maple Park Grace United Methodist Church (16 miles from Malta). Pastor Jeremiah will continue to live in the Malta U.M.C. Parsonage.

Maple Park U.M.C. will pay half the housing cost, half the utility expenses and half the health insurance. Malta's Treasurer will pay the total amounts and then bill Maple Park U.M.C. for their half.

Both churches have 9:00 a.m. Worship Services. Bishop Schwerin and the Cabinet asked Malta U.M.C. to move their Worship Service time to 11:00 a.m. Malta's Administrative Council will be working out several of these changes. Their next Church Council Meeting is Monday, June 5th.

We are praying this transition will be a Blessing for Everyone. Our first 11:00 a.m. Worship Service will be Sunday, July 2, 2023.

BEST APPLE CAKE

Kitty Jouris

1 Cup Oil

2 C. Sugar

3 Eggs

1 1/2 tsp. Vanilla

1 tsp. Salt

1 tsp. Baking Soda

3 C. Apples, (peeled & chopped)

2 C. Flour

1 tsp. Cinnamon (Opt.)

Mix oil, sugar, eggs & vanilla. Add flour, salt, and baking soda. Stir in apples, pour into greased pan.

350 Degrees (9 X 13 Pan) Bake 50-60 minutes (Check at 50 minutes with toothpick test).

Cool completely before adding topping.

CARMEL TOPPING:

½ C. Butter 1 C. Brown Sugar ¼ C. Milk

Mix together in saucepan over medium heat. Boil 3 minutes. Spread immediately over cooled cake. (Serves 12-20)

The 184th session of the Northern Illinois Annual Conference is set to take place June 6th – June 8th, 2023. The Conference will return to the Renaissance Schaumburg Convention Center at 1551 N. Thoreau Dr., Schaumburg, IL, again this year.

Continuing with the theme, "Connected in Christ"; the 2023 theme is "Connected in Christ: Come to the Table," placing the focus on one of the core elements of our Christian faith: the sacrament of communion. Communion brings us into the real presence of Christ on a regular basis. As we join at the table, we are nourished so that we might bring Christ into the world, ultimately forming community, from baptism to the communion table. By participating in communion and becoming a community, we are called in ministry and mission. This theme allows us to go outside of the temporal issues of the world into a deeper theological reflection and ideology of God's grace offered to us while also calling us into action.

The scriptural grounding for this year's theme is Luke 11:3, "Give us each day OUR daily bread." Bishop Dan Schwerin will preside and preach at the ordination service on Luke 11:1-8. Rev. Dr. Myron F. McCoy, Senior Pastor at Chicago: First (Temple) United Methodist Church, will preach on Psalm 23 at the Memorial Service.. Dr. Rolf Nolasco, professor of spiritual formation and pastoral theology at Garrett-Evangelical Theological Seminary, will be leading Bible Study. The worship leader is Rev. Dr. Addison Shields, Jr., with musical accompaniment by Wanda J. Bishop.




DID YOU KNOW?

Memorial Day (originally known as Decoration Day^[1]) is a federal holiday in the United States for mourning the U.S. military personnel who have died while serving in the United States armed forces.^[2] It is observed on the last Monday of May. It was formerly observed on May 30 from 1868 to 1970.^[3]

Many cities and people have claimed to have first celebrated the event. In 1868, General John A. Logan of the Grand Army of the Republic called for a "Decoration Day", which was widely celebrated. By 1890, every Northern state had adopted it as a holiday. The World Wars turned it into a generalized day of remembrance, instead of just for the Civil War. In 1971, Congress standardized the holiday as "Memorial Day" and changed its observance to the last Monday in May.

Two other days we celebrate in the U.S. military are: Armed Forces Day
(May 21, 2022), an
unofficial U.S. holiday for honoring
those currently serving
in the armed forces, And
Veterans Day (on November 11),
which honors those who have served
in the United States Armed Forces. [5]
