PASTOR JEREMIAH'S MESSAGE

As we prepare for October, and I at least, hope that it brings some change in the weather with some cooler temperatures. We are also preparing for a new sermon series that will guide us through the month. As I talked about with the Cluster Youth this past Sunday (Sept. 19, in Ecclesiastes 4:12 we are advised that "a threefold cord, is not easily broken." What this means is that when people are in community with each other we are stronger in every way. When we are part of a faith community our relationship with God is stronger than it can ever be on our own, and together we are stronger than we can ever be on our own.

When one joins a United Methodist Congregation, something many of us have done, we make 5 vows about how we will support and strengthen that congregation so that all of us may grow in faith and better love with each other and with all people in Christ's Name. These 5 vows are to support the church through our **prayers**, our **presence**, our **gifts**, our **service**, and our **witness**. In the 5 Sundays of October, we will be spending a Sunday on each of these with the following:

- October 3: World Communion Sunday: Speaking of presence and how being together for worship and other events builds us all up.
- October 10: Speaking of prayers, and what it means to pray for our church.

- October 17: What does service mean? It doesn't just mean volunteering around the church, but also helping each other beyond the doors of our building.
- October 24: When we speak of gifts, yes we mean financial and other material resources. So we will ask the question how is God asking us to give?
- October 31: Reformation Sunday:
 Witness as we remember the start
 of the movement that led to our
 denomination. We will ask what
 does it mean to witness to our faith,
 and share how our faith has
 reformed our lives.

So, whether you are a member of our church or not, I hope you can join us as we consider how we can all strengthen each other and equip each other to love the world in Jesus' Name.

BLUEBERRY CRUNCH CAKE

Ingredients:

1 tall can crushed pineapple, undrained

3 cups Blueberries
½ cup Sugar
1 cup Chopped Pecans
1 stick plus 2 tbsp. butter, melted
½ c Sugar
1 box Yellow Cake Mix

Directions:

Preheat oven to 350F. Butter a 9 x 13 baking dish. Pour pineapple into the baking dish. In a bowl add 1 tspd. butter to blueberries. Stir to coat and add ½ cup sugar and stir. Place blueberries uniformly over pineapple in baking dish. Sprinkle dry cake mix over top of blueberries. Drizzle the melted stick of butter over the cake mix. Add 1 tbsp. butter to chopped pecans and stir in ¼ cup of sugar and place on top of cake mix. Bake 1 hour.

COMMITTEE ON FINANCE & STEWARDSHIP

CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT FUND DRIVE

Our Fund Drive started in mid-September when all members of Malta UMC received a letter describing major repairs needed on our beautiful, old church building. The roof and some of the worst concrete decay must be taken care of this fall. The bid the Trustees accepted on this work is \$125,000 and a loan is being secured from Resource Bank to cover that cost. Work is to begin Tuesday, September 28, and our first payment of \$44,000 has been made.

Some projects have been completed and several are still on our "to do" list. Our existing Capital Improvement Fund has been depleted. Thus, we have set a goal to raise \$200,000 over the next four years (\$50,000 per year) in order to pay our loan, complete projects, and hopefully have some money left in our fund for expenses unknown at this time.

As of Sunday, September 26, prayers have been answered in the amount of \$41,000 and our Fund Drive is well on its way. The generosity and caring spirit of our church is tremendous! We have faith that our church (the people of Malta UMC) will do all they can to support this campaign and contribute as much as they can to meet our goal of raising \$200,000 in four years.

May it be God's will for us to get these repairs done and keep our building structurally safe and sound as well as financially out of debt. Please consider how you can help.


HELPING OUR KIDS
