

PASTOR JEREMIAH'S MESSAGE

My first job with a paycheck was working for a buffet in my hometown in Kankakee. Some People like buffets, because you can choose what you want. Make the salad the way you want, choose from the food, choose from the cookies for dessert, etc. There were many things to experience, and if you were new to the buffet there were new things to try.

In September and through much of the fall our sermons will be based on lectionary readings. The Revised Common Lectionary is a series of readings from the Bible for each week of worship that touch on many different parts of the bible. If you read all of them over their 3-year cycle you would of read much of the Bible. The lectionary is wonderful because it gives us more from the Bible. I know I am often drawn to read the same parts of scripture repeatedly. That is a good thing as these words give me hope, inspiration, comfort, and helps me feel God's love. However, when I look at parts of the Bible that I've not read as much, God often inspires me in a new way. Or a passage I've not read in a long time speaks to me in a new way because my life is not in the same place as the last time I read it.

I invite you, in the weeks ahead, to first, read your Bible; you will find things that will inspire you, challenge you, comfort you, and will likely raise questions for you, that can help you learn more. Secondly, I also invite you to read parts of scripture that you don't know as well, to see what there might be there that you have never read before or perhaps have not read for a long time.

May we explore the Bible together and see what unexpected places God wants to guide us as we seek to grow in faith, and share Jesus' love with the world.

STRAWBERRY - RHUBARB PIE

FILLING:

5 C. Rhubarb 1 T. Butter 1 C. Strawberries ½ C. Flour 1 ½ C. Sugar

CRUST:

2 C. All Purpose Flour 1 Tsp. Salt \(^1\text{4} C + 3 T. Lard\) 4 to 5 T. Ice Cold Water

Mix ingredients together for filling and set aside. Prepare crust by cutting lard into flour & salt mixture with a fork until it looks like cornmeal. Add 4 to 5 tablespoons of ice cold water, until sides of the bowl come clean and mixture will pack. Do not overmix, that's what makes it tough. Keep it cold. Roll crust out and place into 10 inch pie pan. Add filling and bake at 350 degrees for 45 minutes.
